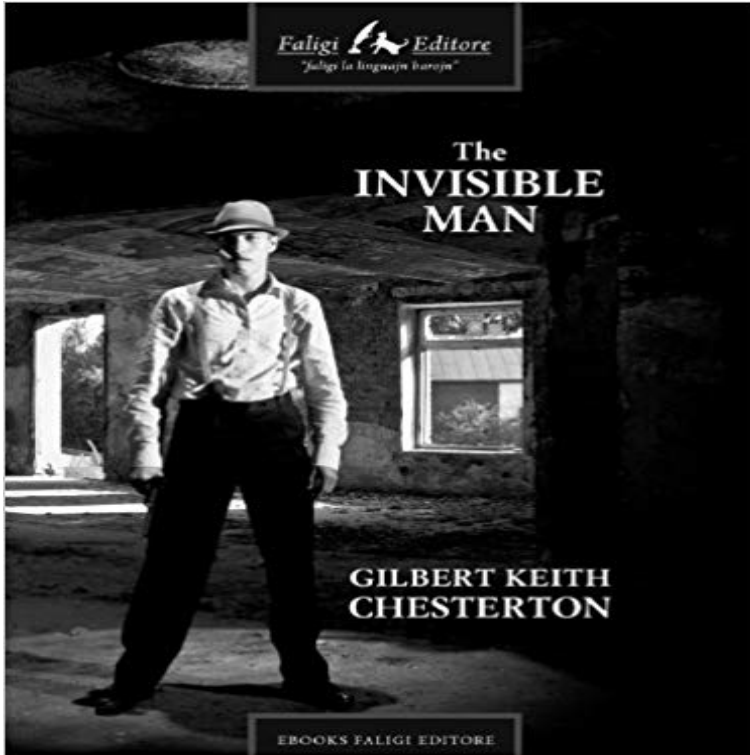


# The Invisible Man
